Pastor Jeff's Jottings

I walked into my church office this morning and shivered. Now most of you know this is a common event because the heat struggles to make it to my office anyway. But today I shiver more than usual. It is 55 degrees and the furnace doesn't seem to be working. It's almost zero outside and colder days lie ahead. My first thought is to complain, but then I start to think about those people in our community who may not have heat at all. Many may not even have a reasonable place to live. And all of a sudden, I am happy that it is 55 in here... it could be worse.

God calls us to care for those less fortunate than us. What better time of the year to set an example that we love our community and all the people in it. What can you do to help? It might be easier than you think.

There has been a fund established at the Cast Iron Kitchen restaurant for those that need a hot meal to come in and be fed. The resources in that fund have been provided by churches, businesses, and individuals that feel they have been called to help feed the hungry.

There are clothing racks inside the gazebo in the park downtown where you can leave your gently used clothing and those in need can come by and claim what they can use. Again, this service is provided by those who feel called to clothe those people who need warm clothing.

We host a community dinner in our fellowship hall every Wednesday evening. In the corner of the fellowship hall there is a table where occasionally you will find food and clothing that has been donated. This has been done knowing that many of the people that attend this dinner each week, have a need for food and clothing the rest of the week, also. Please feel free to add a donation to that table if you feel led.

Finally, the senior class at Manton HS is participating in a service project that will provide daily essential needs to local homeless shelters. We will have a box available in the fellowship hall to help collect items such as toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, non-perishable foods, brushes and combs, deodorants, feminine products, tissue, toilet paper, wet wipes, band-aids, and socks. I saw a report this week that the most needed item at homeless shelters is socks... warm socks!!

These are just a few of the ways you can help care for the less fortunate in our own community, and as always, we can cover them in prayer. May God bless each of you, our church, and our community. *For there will never cease to be poor in the land. New District Superintendent

On January 7th Bishop David A. Bard welcomed the Rev. Jodie Flessner and thanked the Rev. Anita Hahn for service on The Michigan Conference Cabinet and the Northern Waters District. JANUARY 07, 2019 | LANSING MI — The Northern Waters District of The Michigan Conference will welcome a new district superintendent **beginning July 1, 2019**.

Bishop David Alan Bard today announced the appointment of the Rev. Jodie Flessner, currently serving as the pastor at Caledonia United Methodist Church, to be the next district superintendent for the Northern Waters District. She follows the Rev. Anita Hahn who has served the maximum of eight years as a district superintendent.

"In discerning a person to succeed Rev. Hahn, I wanted a person who also has a passionate faith in Jesus Christ and deep desire to help the church flourish in these changing times," said Bishop Bard. "I wanted a person who has a solid record of leadership in local congregations and the wider United Methodist Church. In appointing the Rev. Jodie Flessner, I found such a person. Rev. Flessner has leadership experience in congregations, cooperative parishes, in the conference and the wider United Methodist Church. She brings to this position a deep faith, a pastor's sensibility, experience with creative forms of ministry in rural areas, and a passion for helping the church be its best. I know she will work well with her colleagues and enhance our shared ministry as The Michigan Conference."

Bishop Bard also praised current District Superintendent Rev. Anita Hahn who served the Grand Traverse District, one-fifth of the Heartland District, and finally in the newly formed Northern Waters District. "In the midst of significant changes in our Michigan Conference, not to mention significant changes in the religious landscape of the United States, Rev. Hahn has led out of her deep faith in Jesus Christ and her passionate heart to reach new people in new ways with the good news of God's love in Jesus Christ." Bard continued, "Her compassion, creativity, enthusiasm, and warm-hearted faith have been a gift to me, to the Cabinet, and West Michigan and Michigan conferences."

The bishop added, "I hope you will join me in expressing gratitude for both Rev. Anita Hahn and Rev. Jodie Flessner, and in praying for them both in this time of transition."

Pastor is looking at new video equipment to better recorded church services to be viewed online by those who cannot attend in person. Pastor is also still looking for new logo ideas for the church. Finally, Pastor discussed the possibility of forming a men's breakfast group.

December 13, 2018, meeting minutes were distributed, read by council members, voted on and approved. **<u>COMMITTEE REPORTS:</u>**

EDUCATION: Liz Dykgraaf and Jessica LaFreniere will act as co-chairs of the Education Committee. Beth Hissong will continue to do crafts with the children.

TRUSTEES: Dick Raymer reported that the new sign in front of the church is complete and looks great. The lights in the office have been repaired. An estimate of \$2,400 was received to fix the lighting in the sanctuary. Dick will see about getting additional estimates. The upstairs has been cleaned and organized. Also, the toilet in the nursery will be replaced. There was also discussion on the placement of the American flag in the sanctuary. Pastor will inquire about any changes.

MEMORIAL: Jessica VanderBrook will be the new chair of the Memorial Committee.

ENDOWMENT: Nothing new reported.

STEWARDSHIP: Jane Fleming will act as the new chair of the Stewardship Committee. Cheryl Peterson stated that the church has received pledges in the amount of \$87,220 for 2019. However, last year's pledges were over \$86,000 and only just over \$72,000 was received.

MISSION AND OUTREACH: Diane Siddall and Charlene Anderson will act as co-chairs of the Mission and Outreach Committee.

WORSHIP: Terri Swanson reported through Bob that a fund raiser in the form of a variety show is still in the works.

STAFF PARISH: Dana Raymer is the new chair of the Staff Parish. Dana will organize a meeting of the committee members. The reviews for the church employees will go forward.

FINANCE: Cheryl Peterson distributed the church's balance sheet through December 31, 2018. Cheryl explained the accounts, the income, and the expenses of the church for the benefit of the new council members. Cheryl stated that there has been a change in church policy with regard to the payment of the pastor's health insurance. Pastors are now responsible for one half of that expense. Motion was made that the church would pay that expense for the pastor, seconded, voted on and approved.

OTHER BUSINESS: On Sunday, January 27, there will be leadership training at the Methodist Church of Cadillac. All committee members are encouraged to attend. Pastor suggested that we hang the extra TV from upstairs in the fellowship hall. We could use it to scroll church events and church announcements. Then there was discussion on the timing of the committee meetings. It was decided that the Church Council will meet on the fourth Tuesday of each month. This will give the other committees an opportunity to meet and report to the Church Council.

PASTOR JEFF UPDATE: Pastor Jeffrey A. Swainston states he is continuing his course studies. He states that there will be two small group studies. Pastor also discussed the discretionary fund. He receives request for money all the time. He struggles to determine if the requests are for a genuine need or if the requests are from people playing the system. He will continue to do his best to determine real needs. If a person request cash for gas for a genuine need, he does not simply give them cash, but will walk across the street and pay for the gas. The consensus was that he is doing a great job in this area.
